## **Why Take a Doe and Litter Project?**

The purpose of the Doe and Litter project is to give youth the chance to educate themselves on raising rabbits and experience raising a litter of purebred rabbits from the process of selecting a breeding pair to weaning the litter.

Rabbits have many uses. Decide why you are breeding and make goals that will help you to be successful. Some possible reasons to breed rabbits include:

- **Exhibition:** All ARBA recognized breeds can be shown at ARBA and county fair shows. If you are breeding with the goal of producing show animals, make sure your breeding stock are good representatives of their breed as it is described in the ARBA Standard of Perfection.
- **Pets:** Rabbits with good temperaments and with a family history of good health make excellent pets. Even if your goal is breeding show-quality rabbits, not all kits in a litter will be of high enough quality to show and/or breed, so these rabbits can also be sold as pets.
- **Fur/Wool:** Some breeds are bred to be used for their wool or their pelts, such as rex and angora breeds.
- **Meat:** Commercial breeds can also be used for the doe and litter project. The offspring will not be sold at the market auction, but you can potentially be producing your brood animals to use the following project year or to sell to other market exhibitors.

## **Why Keep Records?**

By keeping records, you will be able to see how you progress you make this year and over the course of your 4-H career as you set goals and work to accomplish them.

Good records will:

- Help you learn about animals, their rate of growth, the feed they require, the cost of feed they require, and their habits.
- Increase your understanding of your project's financial outcome.
- Assist you in gathering information to market your animals.
- Improve your management practices.
- Keep track of your project activities and learning experiences.
- Allow you to better plan for future livestock projects.

### **Supplemental Materials**

If you want to be able to advertise your doe and litter kits as “for sale” at fair, the following supplemental materials must be turned in with this **completed** record book before 8:00 pm on check-in day of fair. Remember, committee members are not responsible for advertising or helping with sales of rabbits.

1. Your “for sale” sign to be attached to your pen
  - a. Signs can be no larger than half a standard sheet of printer paper (8.5”x5.5”).
  - b. Signs should state breed, age, and contact info (phone number or email address) at minimum.
  - c. Signs can be handwritten or typed but must be easily read.
  - d. Cardstock or laminated paper will hold up better, but no matter what, make a copy or two for accidents.
  
2. A care guide to give buyers
  - a. Give the rabbits you produce a better chance of success in their new homes with a basic care guide.
  - b. Your guide should give an overview of housing, feedings, and basic care (grooming, cleaning, etc.)
  - c. Make sure your guide is specific to your breed.
  - d. These can be typed or handwritten. If handwritten, writing must be clear and easily read.
