FAIR PACKETS - ADVISORS & COMMITTEES

Advisor Fair Packets and Committee Packets will be available at the Junior Fair Office in the Event Center from 5:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m., Monday, August 28th and during check in on Tuesday. The contents will include general fair information, tickets or wallet card, and a parking sticker. Packets will be distributed on an individual basis and must be signed for upon receipt.

JUNIOR FAIR CHECK – IN – Tuesday, August 29th See below for the details on different livestock:

EXHIBITOR PACKETS: Youth exhibitors in the 2023 Junior Fair will receive tickets and one parking sticker <u>per family</u>. Only youth fair participants receive tickets. Also, due to limited space in special parking areas, **only one gate sticker is provided per family.**

Check In:

- Make sure to keep traffic moving with large animals.
- Small animals must check with a committee member at the barn prior to unloading animal(s). Small animals will receive an inspection slip to check in at the Junior Fair Office.
- Complete necessary paperwork at Junior Fair Paperwork
 Station
- Stop at Junior Fair Office for packet and t-shirt.

DUNF FORMS are online at www.mcjrfair.com. Forms may be completed on **Monday evening or on Tuesday** and submitted to the link provided. **Permission to Treat Forms** are also available on the website and must be printed and brought with you to check in. This form gives permission for your animal to be treated in your absence.

LIVESTOCK CHECK-IN:

IMPORTANT: Livestock Check - in will be Tuesday, August 29 from 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. for Rabbits & Poultry. Saddle Horse should be moved in by 6:30 p.m. All other animals can check in until 8:00 p.m. DO NOT bring animals earlier than the times listed.

SMALL ANIMALS - RABBITS, POULTRY & POCKET PETS &

<u>GOATS</u> Members must report to their committee with their project and make sure they are health checked before they are permitted to be placed in their pens. Member will receive a ticket from the committee to offer proof of health check, which they will take to the Junior Fair Office to complete check in.

All livestock animals exhibiting in the Junior Fair must be in place by Tuesday at the designated time (with the exception of Dairy & Beef Breeding animals which may check-in at the Open Dairy/Beef Office.

DON'T FORGET HEALTH PAPERS!

A copy of your health papers MUST BE in place on your pen. Health papers can be slipped behind your name card on large livestock in the sheet protector. Make sure all required vaccinations

are documented on your health papers. Horses are not required to have health papers, but it is highly recommended they are vaccinated.

ALL JUNIOR FAIR YOUTH EXHIBITORS WILL RECEIVE A 2023 JUNIOR FAIR T-SHIRT COMPLIMENTS OF MILSEK FURNITURE POLISH. If you provided the Junior Fair with your t-shirt size,

shirts will be available during check-in.

TRAFFIC FLOW:

<u>SADDLE HORSE</u>: Enter Gate 11 on Leffingwell Rd. and jog left (Kilkawley Dr) at the trailer then right at the trailer park to continue through Gate E. Turn left on the main road and left again to head back toward the Saddle Horse Tent area. Unload near the horse tents. Exit to Leffingwell Rd.

MARKET BEEF: Enter Gate 11 and continue through Gate E. Enter Gate 11 on Leffingwell Rd. and jog left (Kilkawley Dr) at the trailer then right at the trailer park to continue through Gate E. Continue straight to Event Center wash rack to unload. DO NOT BLOCK THE ROAD BY THE LIVESTOCK TENTS. Exit straight to Route 46

POCKET PETS, RABBIT, POULTRY: Enter Gate 9 and travel to Gate F. Enter Gate F and travel in front of the Event Center and continue straight to unload at Junior Fair Small Animal Barn #35. Exit to Gate 8 or toward the front of the fair.

<u>SWINE, FEEDERS, LLAMAS, GOATS, LAMBS:</u> Enter Gate 9 and watch for signs to enter a temporary Gate near the Event Center. <u>MARKET SWINE</u> will stay to the left to unload on the south side of the Event Center. <u>ALL OTHERS</u> will continue straight to unload at your tent area. <u>MARKET SWINE</u> will exit back toward Gate 9. <u>ALL OTHERS</u> will turn right past the tents and turn right on the first drive past the small barns to exit out through the horse area.

ANIMAL CARE - LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION CHECK LIST:

- Important: DO NOT FORGET TO TAKE CARE OF YOUR ANIMAL. Animals should be cleaned & fed by 9:00 a.m.
- Feed & Water bowl, pan, bucket ...Check in your area to see what is provided.
- Grooming & Showing supplies. Check in your area for the rules regarding tack boxes and space available.
- Clean up equipment: Make arrangements within your club i.e. wheelbarrow, rake, broom,,,
- DO NOT FORGET HEALTH PAPERS, PERMISSION TO TREAT FORM & to complete DRUG NOTIFICATION FORM ONLINE.
- DO NOT CHANGE PEN ASSIGNMENTS WITHOUT PERMISSION FROM THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

NOTE: ALL MARKET FEEDER EXHIBITORS MUST REPORT TO A COMMITTEE MEMBER UPON THE COMPLETION OF MORNING CHORES FOR STALL INSPECTION EACH DAY.

PLEASE CONTACT A COMMITTEE MEMBER IF YOU NEED HAY AND/OR STRAW.

UNHEALTHY ANIMALS & PEOPLE MUST STAY HOME

The Junior Fair Manager, the Senior Fair Board Director in charge of Junior Fair and/or the Fair Vet have the right to request the removal of unhealthy animals from the grounds. Any exhibitor wishing to remove their animal from the grounds must have permission from the Junior Fair Manager – Kim Moff, Senior Fair Director – Ward Campbell or Bob Jarvis, and/or the Fair Vet – Lisbon Vet Clinic. If your animal becomes sick during the fair, stop by the Junior Fair Office and we can help contact the vet.

Please review the Health guidelines provided by Lisbon Vet Clinic which has been sent along with this newsletter.

SCRAPIES ID FOR GOATS & SHEEP

We must have <u>proper scrapies ID</u> for your animal if they are to exhibit at the 2023 Junior Fair. All Scrapie's information must be on file by check – in. If using a tattoo for scrapies ID in goats, then a copy of the registration must be provided no later than **AUGUST 29**.

ANIMALS ON DISPLAY MUST STAY ON DISPLAY

Animals on exhibit must remain on exhibit throughout the fair. NO

ANIMALS ARE PERMITTED TO LEAVE THE FAIRGROUNDS IN

THE EVENING AND RETURN TO SHOW, except for dogs.

DOG EXHIBITION

Dogs will be exhibited at the 2023 Junior Fair during the assigned shifts, and during the Junior Fair Dog Shows and Demonstrations. Day time housing will be provided in the barn. Youth must bring portable kennel, water bowl and such for the day. Contact your advisor for info.

CELL PHONE POLICY FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

Absolutely no cell phones and/or electronic devices will be permitted in the show ring. Leave them in your tack box, with family, with friends.... some place safe; but not in your pocket. If an electronic device is heard or seen during the show, the youth will be dismissed from the show ring. This policy pertains to all Junior Fair Livestock exhibitors. Saddle Horse State Rules state that the youth will be disqualified from the class in which they are participating. As a safety concern, and out of respect for other youth exhibitors; we expect everyone to work with this policy. Also, please be respectful using Social Media and only post positive pictures and comments in regards to your fair experience.

CANOPY GUIDELINES

No additional canopies or golf carts are permitted in the Junior Fair area in 2023.

POP SHOP NEWS

CANFIELD FAIR DECORATIONS & STALL ASSIGNMENTS

- Please keep area neat & clean at all times.
- Do not initiate any fair construction, painting and/or make any changes in the display areas without permission.
- Please clean up after your animals, especially in the aisles.
- Keep wash areas clean.
- Do not use wood chips too heavy in display area. In case of rain, wood chips can cause drains to block.

Decorate tack stalls and/or empty stalls in your area. With the increase in exhibitors, we will have less room to store tack & supplies. Please try to keep areas tidy and equipment put away. Share tack boxes with other exhibitors when possible.

<u>CLEAN AREA AWARDS</u> will be given in recognition of youth and clubs keeping areas clean in some locations.

EMERGENCY LIST

Clubs should keep a list of phone numbers of members and/ or parents or relatives in case of emergency. If an emergency should occur, report the situation to the Junior Fair Manager or Sr. Fair Board Director of Jr. Fair. Please Note: Neither the Senior Fair Board nor Canfield Fair carry insurance to cover exhibitors, their property and/or livestock during the fair. This is the responsibility of the individual. Please try not to panic. If an ambulance IS NEEDED, try to contact Ward Campbell or Kim Moff initially, and then assign one person to call 911. With animal emergencies, notify Ward or
