

2022 Year-End Points Recognition Rules

1. Award sign-ups will be available at the Horse Symposium and the first two horse shows (May 21, 2022 & May 22, 2022). A \$35.00 fee to participate will be charged. Fees are due at time of sign up. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
2. In the case of a rider signing up for year-end points with two different horses/projects: Points will be tabulated on each horse project separately; not the rider. Points are not added together. Each project will require a separate back number and a \$35.00 fee per horse.
3. The maximum points for any class are 10. Points for classes will be calculated as follows:

1st = 10, 2nd=9, 3rd = 8, 4th = 7, 5th = 6, 6th = 5, 7th = 4, 8th = 3, 9th = 2, 10th = 1

One participation point will be awarded for each rider entering the show ring that does not place. Except for dismissals based on unsportsmanlike or unethical disqualifications.

4. Only age group classes count toward year-end points. Open classes do not count towards age group classes; they will only count for the Open Division.
5. Canfield Junior Fair events do not count toward year end points or awards.
6. Awards divisions include Western, English, Contest, Mini, Ranch, Jumping and Ground Roping.
7. Awards are presented to the top two participants in each division.
8. Age groups for each are indicated on the Specialty Division page.
9. Specialty divisions include Trail in Hand, Trail, Scurry, and Poles and Barrels. Mini horse divisions include Trail in Hand, Hunter in Hand, Driven Trail, and Pleasure Driving
10. If in the event a hardship occurs, and families utilize the same project for multiple members, each member must show or compete in a different discipline. Each rider must have a separate back number and points will be calculated separately for each rider.
11. Definition of Walk-Trot: The Walk-Trot (W/T) Division is intended for the exhibitor who is just beginning to ride or has not reached a comfort level to enter canter classes. Once the exhibitor is comfortable to canter with a degree of control, the rider should advance to the appropriate age division. The rider's level of experience should not be limited to just the show ring. Walk-Trot will be offered as a two-year project for members 13 years and under only. Youth 14 and over are permitted to exhibit one year in Walk-Trot. To continue to exhibit in the Walk-Trot, youth and a parent/guardian must request permission from the MSHC. Only those approved shall be permitted to remain in Walk-Trot. Participants in Walk-Trot may not canter in any class. Once the rider has cantered, they will no longer be eligible for Walk-Trot classes. Riders participating in Walk-Trot must be enrolled in the projected by June 1st of the current year.

2022 Year-End Points Recognition Divisions

Mini Division:

18 & Under Open

Point Classes: Showmanship, Jumpers in Hand, Reinsmanship

English Division:

Walk-Trot 13 & Under 14 to 18 Open

Point Classes: Showmanship, English Equitation, English Pleasure, and English Road Hack

Jumping Division:

2'0" to 2'3" 2'3" to 2'6"

Point Classes: Hunter Over Fences, Equitation Over Fences, and Hunter Hack

Western Division:

Walk-Trot 13 & Under 14 to 18 Open

Point Classes: Showmanship, Western Horsemanship, Western Pleasure, and Western Road Hack

Ranch Division:

Walk-Trot 13 & Under 14 to 18 Open

Point Classes: Ranch Showmanship, Ranch Pleasure, Ranch Riding, and Ranch Horsemanship

Ground Roping Division:

13 & Under 14 to 18 Open

Contest Division:

Walk-Trot 13 & Under 14 to 18 Open

Point Classes: Barrels, Pole Bending, Stakes, and Keyhole

2022 Year-End Points Recognition Specialty Divisions

Hunter in Hand:

Mini Horse Only

Trail In Hand:

Includes all age groups/ Mini Horse- This class is for equine to be exhibited with the handler on the ground, showing the animal through the obstacles. An exhibitor **cannot** show the same horse in Trail at the same show.

Trail:

This class is for equine to be ridden by exhibitor through a course, exhibitor **cannot** show the same horse in Trail In Hand at the same show.

Walk-Trot Trail:

This class is for equine to be ridden by the exhibitor through a course designed for Walk-Trot competitors only.

Driven Trail:

Mini Horse Only

Pleasure Driving:

Mini Horse Only
